Before you bring the pet home:

Set up his cage with bedding at least an inch thick or more at the bottom of the cage. Place a full food bowl and full water bottle attached to the cage. Place toys in the cage.

The car ride home:

Keep your pet in the carrier during the full duration of the ride. Keep the box in sight so it doesn't fall over or bounce around. Don't let your pet out during the ride as they may get lost in your car.

Necessary supplies for my pet:

- 1. Non scented and non colored bedding fluff or wood shavings for small pets
- 2. Food for your specific species.
- 3. Food bowl and water bottle that they can't tip over or chew through.
- 4. For small animals use a sturdy cage such as a large guinea pig or "rabbit" cage.
- 5. Toys that your pet is allowed to chew on, such as wooden blocks without coloring.

Your first week with your new pet:

Some experts recommend that with small pets you don't touch them for the first week and let them get accustomed to their cage and surroundings.

First day out of cage:

Before picking him up we recommend you wash your hands, any food smells can lead to your small pet thinking you are trying to give him a treat.

We recommend keeping your pet within arms reach and always keeping an eye on him. Block off an area of ground that is clean and safe where he can't escape.

Fun fact: Guinea Pigs need timothy hay 24/7 in their cage to eat just like a rabbit does.
